plain scrap or cane scrap.

Prep: roll out two sheets of black (#1 or thickest setting)

- 1. Make a block of scrap (can be canes or plain clay).
- 2. Cut 1/8" slice from block and roll to a #4 or medium thickness.
- 3. Back with a light color (#4 thick)
- 4. Trim one edge.
- 5. Burnish to table for cutting.
- 6. Cut a 1mm thin slice and lay onto prepped black sheet of clay. Continue to cut 1mm slices

and apply onto black sheet. Offset strips and space them apart a bit. Fill the black sheet.

7. Turn filled black sheet 90° and repeat cutting slices off and applying onto second prepped

black sheet of clay. Offset strips but space evenly. Thick, thin and angles cuts are fine as

long as spaces between strips are fairly even.

- Brayer over in different directions using uneven pressure. Some light color backing should show around squares.
- 9. Roll through pasta machine on #1/thickest setting.

Can stretch in places to make spacing more even, etc.

The other technique was making a Stroppel Cane using scrap clay and then using the resulting loaf of clay for mokume gane.

Experiment! Have fun!
