June Recap: Windchimes with Sharon Mhyre

Last month Sharon gave us a nice demonstration on wind chimes. She described the parts that make a wind chime (the hanger, the cord, the noise makers, the striker, and the sail).

She showed us which parts could be clay (the hanger, decorations above and below the noise makers, and the sail), and gave a very thorough supply list for some of the other parts. For the cord she gave examples of cords that could be used only inside, and which could be for outside chimes. For the hanger, she showed some fun examples of cardboard shapes (that could be covered with clay). For the noise makers she showed shells, bells, and tubes.





2022 Mini Gingerbread House Party



Our Zoom party worked quite well last year, so that's what we're doing again this year! We do a candy swap ahead of time (we had 10 swappers last year). Get the candy to me by November 20th, 2022. What you need to make: Miniature Candies

Candies must be handmade by you and made out of polymer clay (can include things like toothpicks for lollipop stems).



Small, small! The houses are only about 2 x 3 inches. For example, a peppermint hard candy might be 1 inch diameter in real life, but the size candy for a house would be more like ¼ of an inch in diameter. This is around a 1:4 ratio.

Quantity

We'll take whatever people turn in, and divide it into as many piles as there are swap participants.


Where

Miniature candies can be delivered to me by mail or by being dropped off at my house. If you mail, please include return postage, or let us know if you need Guild help to pay for shipping costs. We don't want postage to be a limiting factor on participation.



Candy Ideas

We've had many parties and many types of candies over the years! Online Fall Clay Camp Teachers Wanted



I've had very few people express an interest. If that's the case, we can just have it be a very small event. If people just don't understand what I'm asking for, I'll try and clarify and see if we can get any other interest.

We are looking for short, prerecorded (you can come to my house to record if that helps) demos of beginner

friendly techniques or projects. These demonstrations can be anywhere from 10 to 60 minutes long. So far I believe we have one person demonstrating using silk screens. I haven't nailed down what I want to do yet (too many ideas!). If you are willing to volunteer, but need a project idea, I'd be happy to help.

Ideally, the teacher for the class would be available during the live Clay Camp on Zoom to answer questions, but we don't have a date set yet (mostly because we don't have teachers).

Goals:

- August Finalize demonstration list, choose Clay Camp weekend (probably Friday-Sunday)
- September Record demos
- October Free Beginner Online Clay Camp



We don't know what Clay Camp will look like next year. So far it is looking to be a smaller event, possibly held in a hotel. If you know of any possible locations, please send them to me because that would be a huge help.

Anyways, regardless of where we host clay camp, the swap theme is Cats and/or Dogs. You can make things that involve cats, that involve dogs, or that have both of

them. Here's some possible ideas for those that like to get started well ahead of time: face pins, dangling earrings, figurines, candle holders, and ornament wearing a Santa hat, bookmarks, croc charms, beads, canes, inchies, keychains, phone holders, barrettes, hair sticks, lightswitch plates, covered mugs, vases. It is very open ended, which inspires panic in some, but try to think of it as freeing, since you can make whatever your heart desires.

You must include polymer clay in your work, it must be handmade by yourself. It can include other mediums as well.

There is no size minimum or maximum.

You must do groups of 5 or 10. You may do as many groups as you'd like. For 2022 we had around 17 swappers, who did anywhere from 5 items to 25 items. The only request is that each grouping must be different. For example, if you decide to do two groups of 10 sculptures each, the two groups must be different from each other. Within a group they don't have to be the same.
