

I'm not a carving expert, but I learned a lot (especially what not to do!) making my hollow carved totems for the swap this year. I'll be demonstrating a few techniques, with the main focus on carving using an exacto knife plus heat.



I'll also show my beginning efforts with an engraving bit. Mostly after the techniques, my goal will be to encourage your imagination as I explore several applications of carved pieces, including 3D ornaments and layered stacked designs. Official Clay Camp 2023 News

After several months of trying to get input on venues, and after losing a lot of money this year for not meeting the minimum number of campers at Camp Huston, your Clay Camp committee (it sounds official, but it's Maria, myself, Meredith, Sharon, and anyone that wants to help!) has made a decision regarding Clay Camp 2023. Our usual weekend was not available unfortunately. If we like this location we can reserve it more in advance next year, so give us feedback.



- Location: Artworks 200 Dayton St, Edmonds, WA 98020
- Dates: Friday June 2nd through Sunday June 4th, 2023

This will be a short and sweet Camp. There are no overnight lodgings (feel free to try and find a local friend, we'll also ask if any locals have spare rooms they're making available), but it is close to many Airbnbs and hotels. There are no prepared meals, though we've tossed around the idea of at least one potluck. There are many fantastic and close by restaurants, along with the fridge and microwave options.



What it does have: Lots of room, tables, folding chairs, ovens, a full working kitchen with dishwasher, fridge, oven, stovetop, microwave, water dispenser, hot water, concrete floor (no cleaning clay from carpet, yay!), and two bathrooms. It does have a

separate room we can use for classes, if we decide to offer classes. Because we are the only people for those three days, we can set up Friday and leave everything out until Sunday evening. It also has our complete Guild library of many many books if you want inspiration!

There is much still up in the air. We will have our swap, we will have a non-raffle raffle, we will have a brown bag exchange, we will have a free table, and we will have a snack table. What else we do is up for discussion. Do we want to do classes, or just have free scheduled demos? Do we want to do a potluck every day or just once? Do a few people with slow cookers want to offer to make specialty meals (vegan?) for help with ingredient costs?

Anyways, throwing out ideas. We do not yet have a price, and we don't know if it will be available on a day camper basis or only for the three days yet.

What you need to make: Miniature Candies

Candies must be handmade by you and made out of polymer clay (can include things like toothpicks for lollipop stems).

Size



Small, small! The houses are only about 2 x 3 inches. For example, a peppermint hard candy might be 1 inch diameter in real life, but the size candy for a house would be more like $\frac{1}{4}$ of an inch in diameter. This is around a 1:4 ratio.

Quantity

We'll take whatever people turn in, and divide it into as many piles as there are swap participants.

Where

Miniature candies can be delivered to me by mail or by being dropped off at my house. If you mail, please include return postage, or let us know if you need Guild help to pay for shipping costs. We don't want postage to be a limiting factor on participation.




Candy Ideas


