

April Make-Along Program

For our next meeting (April 2nd, very early in the month so mark your calendars) I'll be leading our make-along with an easy tutorial on cat sculpting. This is to give those that haven't started their clay camp swap things a bit of inspiration. We will do a quick and dirty sculpt to show the basics such as attaching pieces, smoothing clay, and then proceed from there to show how to take your easy sculpt to the next level with different poses, different faces, blending the clay, and some coloring ideas.

Bring some conditioned clay (scrap is fine, but I'd recommend you blend it all to one color if using scrap), a tiny smidge of white, black, pink, and an eye color clay of your choice. For tools if you have ball stylus tools, small knitting needles, silicone tipped sculpting tools those are best, but I'll also show how to substitute things you have around your house for them such as marbles, paint brush handles, toothpicks, etc.

Here's what we know about 2023 Camp Clay (we have a new name! maybe). We have a few awesome teacher proposals, and the possibility of a few more coming in by our deadline of March 31st. Then the board will discuss/approve the teaching proposals, and we'll be able to start drafting an official schedule for the classes. Maria will create the registration (possibly available mid April), and we will

send an announcement when it is officially open.

The cost to attend Camp will be \$100 for members (higher for non-members), not including classes which will have their own fees. This is for all three days of the Camp, no partial day registrations. People will not need to register for Camp if they register for and attend for classes only.

We have a couple of people that have expressed an interest in performing short demos. There will be scheduled classes. We will have a swap (theme is cats and/or dogs, see website for details), a brown bag exchange, a Bottles of Hope competition, a potluck, a raffle of donated items, and a free table where people put things they'd like to give away that they think others might like.

We're still seeking local people that may be willing to host someone that needs to travel. The Best Western is within walking distance of Artworks, and I believe several members are making reservations there for the convenience.

If there is interest, we may have some volunteers make some communal food options available in exchange for help with the ingredient cost (think crockpot type meals).

Due to facility resources, we may be sharing six-foot tables with one other camper, but there will be plenty of space around the perimeter of the room for additional clay supply storage, just something to be aware of when planning your workspace.

Campers may also bring a few items for sale (handmade clay or clay supply), but there will be no cashier, just working on an honor system. Leave your items with prices marked, and the name of who to pay, and don't take up more than your share of the space.

Blueberry Beads offers members a discount on clay (just mention you're a current NWPCG member, they have a list they can check against), and O'Joy Creations


Review
