I will be showing you how I cover light switch plates. You will decorate these with your own canes, beads, crystals and textures.

For this project you will need:

- Light switch or outlet plate. I get mine at Habitat for Humanity, if you can get metal ones that's great,
- A Skinner blend, in your choice of colors, made with 1/2 pkg of each color. Roll it out on your 2nd thickest setting,
- Texture sheet,
- Canes to complement your skinner blend, and
- Any decorative elements you might want to add like glitter, mica powders, etc.

Veneers



Here are the veneers Dawn made:






Here are some step by steps of how she made some of those stenciled veneers. $\,$



The layers, in order done. Skinner blend, circles stencil with copper mica powder, flower stencil, color shift paint



This one gave me the most trouble. I started with blue color shift paint, once dry I rolled over a fish stencil until it was embedded and used blue mica powder. Quite a lot of the paint adhered to the stencil rather than the clay. It was very difficult to get the clay off of the stencil. It would have worked much better if I had not pushed the stencil into the painted surface.



Started with black clay. Used punchinella embedded in the clay. Used pan pastels, gold mica powder, green Dylusions spray, pink liquid pearls and green liquid Kato on the surface. Dawn's product list from March Program:
